

Investing in the future of the career development industry



There is optimism for the future of the industry



Nine in ten of those in the career development industry (93%) believe the industry will be better or about the same in five years' time.

A snapshot of the career development industry



67% hold a relevant post-graduate qualification ==== being a Graduate (Certificate in Career Development or higher)

while 15% deliver elements of career development in

14% holding a Certificate IV in Career Development

Those working in the career development industry often transition into career development after working in a different industry.

81% have experience beyond their field, having transitioned from a different industry or role into career development.

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Those working in the career development industry have high job satisfaction



Two in three people working in the career development industry (64%) see themselves working in the industry in five years' time.

One in three (34%) see themselves continuing to work in their current role in the next five years. Currently the average job tenure in Australia is 2 years 9 monthsⁱ

One in five (19%) expect to retire in the coming five years, highlighting the need to develop the supply of new people working in the career development industry
